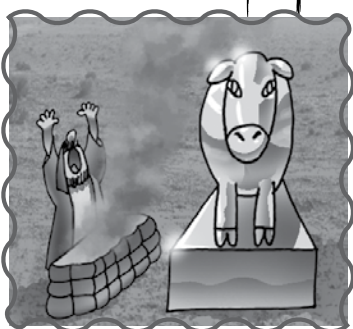
PRICELESS LUCHOS SHATTERED
